

ORDINANCE 2013-O-03

Amending Chapter 44 Traffic, section 44-9: Restricting truck traffic (SUMMARY)

A. THE DEFINITION OF "TRUCK" IS A MOTOR VEHICLE, EXCEPT A MULTI-PURPOSE PASSENGER VAN, DESIGNED, USED, AND MAINTAINED PRIMARILY TO CARRY PROPERTY (AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 11-171 OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF MARYLAND).

B. IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO OPERATE A TRUCK IN EXCESS OF 5 TONS' GROSS WEIGHT UPON OR THROUGH ALL STREETS OR PORTIONS OF STREETS POSTED BY SIGNS WHICH GIVE NOTICE OF SUCH PROHIBITION.

C. THE PROHIBITION CONTAINED IN SUBSECTION (B) SHALL NOT APPLY TO ANY TRUCK WHICH IS MAKING LOCAL PICK-UPS OR DELIVERIES OF GOODS, SUPPLIES, MERCHANDISE OR MATERIALS OR WHICH IS PROVIDING SERVICES TO ANY BUSINESS OR HOUSEHOLD LOCATED IN THE "NO TRUCK" POSTED AREA. THE TRUCK MUST MAKE THE LOCAL PICK-UPS OR DELIVERIES OF GOODS, SUPPLIES, MERCHANDISE OR MATERIALS OR WHICH IS PROVIDING SERVICES TO ANY BUSINESS OR HOUSEHOLD IN A TIMELY MANNER AND OBEY OTHER TOWN ORDINANCES.

ANY VEHICLE FAILING TO OBEY THE "NO TRUCK" SIGN IS IN VIOLATION OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND TRAFFIC ARTICLE 21-201(A) (1) FAILURE TO OBEY TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICE. VIOLATORS WILL BE CITED UNDER THIS STATE LAW.

D. THE PROHIBITION CONTAINED IN SUBSECTION (B) SHALL NOT APPLY TO ANY SUCH TRUCK WHICH IS OWNED OR OPERATED BY A RESIDENT OF EDMONSTON AND IS ALLOWED TO BE PARKED AT THE RESIDENT'S DWELLING IN EDMONSTON.

E. 46TH AVENUE OFF DECATUR STREET IS THE STREET DESIGNATED AS THE ACCESS ROUTE FOR TRUCKS GOING IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD OF LAFAYETTE PLACE, INGRAHAM STREET OR 46TH AVE AVENUE, WHERE INDUSTRIAL AND URBAN LIGHT INDUSTRIAL PROPERTIES ARE LOCATED.

Greetings,

As you may be aware, the Town of Edmonston has a substantial amount of truck traffic entering and leaving our community on a daily basis. This traffic can be dangerous to our residents while also creating congestion that impacts our ability to move around while sometimes impacting progress. Many years ago our Town Council passed an ordinance that prohibits trucks on specified roadways in our community. However, after careful examination of this outdated code, it has been determined that this code needs updating.

On April 11, 2013 a proposed updated ordinance resolution was submitted to the Edmonston Council. The Council voted to adopt the revision of this code, which rescinds the previous version. For your review I have included a copy of the new ordinance. It becomes effective on May 6, 2013. Please be sure to read this new code as it may impact your business.

It is important to note that the new code establishes a specific “truck route” for large trucks travelling into and exiting the industrial area along 46th avenue and Lafayette Place. Please become familiar with this new law. Please educate your drivers. Violations of this new law will be enforced by Maryland Motor Vehicle law, which means violations will be issued a Maryland State moving violation for failing to obey a traffic control device; this may result in substantial fines and points on the driver’s license. I have also included a map of our new established truck route. Please feel free to copy this map and issue it to all of your drivers.

If you oppose this new law you may attend our next scheduled Town Council meeting and address our Council. I am available to discuss this further if you so desire. Please help me make our community safer by adequately preparing your drivers for this ordinance change.

From the Office of the Chief of Police

From time to time I publish articles in our local newsletter that cover such topics as loud noise and parties, traffic safety and crime prevention tips and many others. We also publish police officer activity and local crime statistics. One thing I haven't talked about in a while is some facts about your police department.

The Edmonston Police Department consists of The Chief of Police, and that is me. There is Captain Billy Sullivan, who is second in Command; however, he also patrols the streets and fills in shifts when other officers are unavailable. We have four more officers, Sergeant Richard Hartnett, PFC Brandon Burroughs, PFC Cary Jones and PFC Jeff Hamilton, whose primary duty is patrol.

The primary duties of the Edmonston Police Department are crime prevention, traffic and parking enforcement and community policing. Unfortunately we do not have adequate staffing to conduct criminal investigations. However, we do investigate crimes that are easily solved and require little investigation to close. Police incidents that require more extensive investigations are handled by the Prince George's County Police Department, with whom we work closely. This means we respond to the initial call for the incident and ensure all parties are safe. We then write a report and contact the County Police and ask for an investigator to respond. The case is then turned over for them to handle and investigate.

When you call the police and ask for one of our officers you may from time to time have a Prince George's County Police officer come to your call for assistance. Unfortunately there are some time frames

when our staffing levels require County Police Officers to come into town and handle calls for police service. While would prefer that we handle all calls, we simply do not have adequate funding to staff our agency to that level. The good news is that this happens very little and our current staffing has been very effective in reducing crime and maintaining a low level of crime.

The police department also has one civilian police clerk that works in our office. She answers phone calls and handles administrative clerical duties. This person is Rocio Treminio and she is critically important to our operation.

We do not have dispatchers. All calls for service to our police officers are radio dispatched by the Prince George's County Police Communications center. You may call our officer during the day (9 am to 5 pm) for police service at 301-699-8805.

However, after hours you must call the Prince George's County Police, who will dispatch your request to our officer. **In life threatening situations you must always call 911!** The Prince George's County Police Non Emergency number is 301-352-1200.

The Office of Code Enforcement also comes under the supervision and responsibility of the Chief of Police. Our Code Enforcement Officer is Mr. Randy Kuenzli. Mr. Kuenzli is a very competent and capable Code Enforcement Officer. He handles all incidents where a resident may have inadvertently, or intentionally, violated our town codes, such as constructing a fence or building without a permit. He also can issue parking tickets. Since he has come to Edmonston he has brought a level of professionalism and effectiveness to our town in the area of expertise that we have never had before.

SPRING TIME

Items that you need to know!

Edmonston is a beautiful place to live, work or visit and we ask that each and every person do their part to help keep it that way, so our town stays clean and inviting with fair and reasonable property values.

Please keep the following in mind:

1. **BUILDING * CONSTRUCTION ***

REPAIRS: Check with our Town code enforcement officer to see if a building permit is needed BEFORE you start your project. This will prevent possible delays.

2. **FENCES:** Anywhere in Town except Decatur St. For Decatur St. residents check with Town Hall.

Replace / Repair without modification, no permit is needed. To build... up to 4 ft. no permit needed. However for a fence higher than 4 ft. a permit is required. NO fence can be more that 4 ft. to the front of the building line. No

fence may be erected that blocks the reasonable sight at an intersection.

3. **CARS & TRUCKS:** All vehicles must be registered and must be in working operable order to be on the streets or on private property within the Town. TRUCKS over a 1 ton rated capacity are not permitted to be parked upon the streets or on personal property except in commercial areas not otherwise prohibiting such parking. Trucks over 1 ton may not be parked on private property or streets in residential areas.
4. **GRASS:** Please remember... Grass / weeds cannot be higher than 8 inches. Trees & bushes must be maintained at all times. Vines and weeds cannot be growing or climbing up buildings. Debris, such as tree limbs, must be disposed of, they cannot pile up. GRASS CLIPPINGS must be cleaned up...you are not permitted to leave it in the street. This clogs our drains, causes flooding and is detrimental to the river and Chesapeake Bay area clean water basin.
5. **PARKING:** Parking is NOT permitted in front of the building line on unpaved areas. Parking must be in driveways or other approved parking areas. Parking cannot go against the flow of traffic except in the last block of a dead end street.
6. **COMMERCIAL AREAS:** 46th Ave. / Lafayette Pl. / Ingraham St. / Buchanan St. / Tanglewood Dr. **ALL** Traffic Regulations will be aggressively enforced. This includes, but is not limited to: Stopping, Standing, Parking, Left wheels to curb, opposing traffic directions, Motors running in unoccupied vehicles, keys in vehicles,

Untagged Vehicles, Wrecked & Inoperable vehicles, improper registration displayed, parked too close to intersections, blocking fire hydrants or driveways, obstructing flow of traffic. Traffic Congestion – Streets must remain open and clear of all congestion to maintain the constant flow of traffic and to allow emergency vehicles through.

7. **CHILDREN:** We caution all drivers to be on the lookout for our children. They are out and about enjoying the great weather, playing and riding bikes. PARENTS – we encourage you to help your children learn safety by paying attention to where they play and to motor vehicle traffic around them. Ride in bike lanes, don't chase balls into streets, look both ways when crossing.
8. **BICYCLISTS:** Please remember to share the road with bicycles. Always keep in mind the trail crossing on the west side of the Decatur St. Bridge. Drivers are required to yield to cyclists and pedestrians using the trail.
9. **REPAIRING VEHICLES:** Minor repairs to vehicles are permitted. However, major repairs are not! Repairs to Motors, Transmissions, Axles, Drive lines or other major components are not permitted on the streets or private property of Edmonston, except a duly authorized business in a commercial zone.
10. **BURNING & FIRES:** Outdoor fires or open burning is not permitted for any reason. This includes camping type fires for food or otherwise. Cooking is an exception, on a grill or appropriate fire place intended for such purpose.

11. **ANIMALS:** May not run free! Must be leashed at all times. You are responsible to pick up after your pet, this includes defecation. Animals must be registered and all shots maintained up to date. NO type of farm animal is permitted in residential areas without exception. You will be held responsible if your pet causes a frequent and consistent nuisance to neighbors, as in excessive barking or other means.

12. **TRASH / BULK ITEMS:** Bulk trash is collected on Wednesdays, by Appointment ONLY. This is done by calling Bates on Tuesday between 11AM and 4PM for scheduled pickup. You are limited to approximately 3 items at a time.

13. **BUSINESS LICENSING:** ALL Businesses operating in the Town of Edmonston must be licensed through the Town. License renewal must be completed by July 1 each year. There are late penalties; it pays to be on time.

14. **RENTAL UNITS:** If you own property that you rent out, you are required to have a renter's license. Please contact the town hall for particulars of application and inspections.

15. **SIGNS:** Edmonston has a sign ordinance. It is important to check with town hall before erecting any signs, be they permanent or temporary.

Municipal Ordinances or Code are enacted by your local elected officials; in Edmonston this is your Council and Mayor. Every town has similar ordinances; however, they will vary depending upon the specifics of the area. These are legal and enforceable within our judicial system, by the local police or such

other personnel authorized by the Council and Mayor to perform enforcement. These codes many times are similar to County and State codes but more defined to the specific area.

The main purpose of code enforcement is to obtain compliance in an understanding and cooperative effort between the Officer and resident or violator. This is not always possible, in which case the Officer must resort to enforcement procedures which may include Municipal fines, Court Orders and Abatement processes. All costs incurred are the responsibility of the violator and/or the property occupant / owner. Fines can be doubled or tripled up to \$1000.00 and other costs may be submitted as a lien against the property tax.

If you have any questions it would be to your benefit to ASK FIRST! This will likely save significant headache in the long term. Please feel free to call our office and speak with our Town or Police Clerk or with our Code Enforcement Officer


