The Town of Edmonston will be providing weatherization upgrades, funded by Maryland Energy Administration at no cost to the homeowner if qualified, will save money on monthly utility bills making homes more energy efficient. Participants in the program are required to submit at least 12 months of energy data, proof of income and proof of homeownership.

The program will provide home energy audits to 15 homes; the expected cost reduction is 20% or more on each resident's energy use. The program will provide to each residence an audit of the home; this will include: a blower door test to determine the home's air leakage, combustion and safety testing to detect carbon monoxide and natural gas leaks, review of energy usage of the home's electrical and gas appliances and review of the home's insulation (including the attic's hatch) and building envelope.

Based on the findings of the energy audit some homes may receive ENERGY STAR appliances.

Participants agree to participate in a Community Session with the Town of Edmonston and its partners and be willing to have marketing materials displayed at the home. Participating homes will also be featured in the Town's newsletter.

Homes ineligible for TEEP include:

Rental properties, mold problem, water problem such as a hole in roof or standing water in the basement; home sealed too tight resulting in the inability of fumes to escape through natural ventilation; structure issues, major plumbing issues, or a Gas leak.
